RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE

WESTPORT CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

AUTHORIZING SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT TO ENTER INTO A JOINT AGREEMENT WITH CLINTON-ESSEX-WARREN-WASHINGTON THE COUNTIES BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES D/B/A CHAMPLAIN VALLEY EDUCATIONAL SERVICES ("THE "CEWW BOCES"), AND THE OTHER SIXTEEN (16) COMPONENT SCHOOL DISTRICTS OF THE BOCES FOR THE ACQUISITION OF LAND AND RELATED BUILDINGS, CONSTRUCTION OF RENOVATIONS, ALTERATIONS, ADDITIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO EXISTING BUILDINGS, ALL TO INCLUDE RELATED DEMOLITION, CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATIONS, SITE IMPROVEMENTS, FURNISHINGS, FIXTURES AND EQUIPMENT REQUIRED FOR SUCH PURPOSES, ARCHITECTURAL FEES, GENERAL, MECHANICAL, ELECTRICAL, PLUMBING, ABATEMENT, AND SITE CONSTRUCTION WORK FOR RECONSTRUCTION AND ALTERATIONS, UPGRADE WORK TO VARIOUS BUILDING SYSTEMS AND COMPONENTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 1950 OF THE EDUCATION LAW AND FOR THE ALLOCATION OF THE COSTS OF SUCH CONSTRUCTION AMONG THE COMPONENT SCHOOL DISTRICTS OF THE BOCES.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE WESTPORT CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT (by a vote of not less than a majority of all the members of said Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board of Education of the Westport Central School District (the "School District") is hereby authorized to enter into the Joint Agreement with the BOCES and the other sixteen (16) component school districts in the BOCES, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, which Joint Agreement was approved by the BOCES at its January 17, 2019 meeting and which provides for the acquisition of land and related buildings, construction of renovations, alterations, additions and improvements to existing buildings, all to include related demolition. construction, renovations, site improvements, furnishings, fixtures and equipment required for such purposes, architectural fees, general, mechanical, electrical, plumbing, abatement, and site construction work for reconstruction and alterations, upgrade work to various building systems and components. Said Joint Agreement, in addition to providing for all other matters deemed necessary and proper, (i) sets forth the cost of such construction of additions and improvements to various BOCES buildings and costs incidental thereto and (ii) provides for an allocation and apportionment of a portion of said costs among the seventeen (17) component school districts. including the Westport Central School District, on the equitable basis set forth in said Joint Agreement, and further sets forth the portion of the costs, and the schedule of payment of said costs by each of the seventeen (17) component school districts, including the Westport Central School District.

Section 2. The President of the Board, the chief fiscal officer of the School District, and in his absence the Vice President of the Board, is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Joint Agreement for and on behalf of the School District.

Section 3. The School District hereby agrees to take any and all actions necessary as required by said Joint Agreement to accomplish the purposes and intent of said Joint Agreement.

Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.



Accomplishments and Achievements

- The Quiz Bowl team placed 7th out of 21 teams in the north Country Region.(We are Northernmost team, most teams are from Glens Falls, Saratoga area) The top 8 make the playoffs. If we place in the top 2 overall we compete at the national level in Washington D.C.
- Westport hosted its 3rd annual school bee on January 11th. Approximately 25 students in grades 4-8 qualified for the event during classroom bees held earlier in the month. Our school bee (which is open to community members) rivals the regional bee in terms of excitement, suspense, and degree of word difficulty. Mr. Meyer acted as our pronouncer and emcee, maintaining a proper sense of decorum when reading words, while also bringing some much needed levity (and anticipation) when introducing our three judges with great ceremony: Marie Williams, Janet Hoff, and veteran Darcy Hudson. The regional bee will be held on March 4th in AuSable, and Westport will be represented by grade level champions Kailer Smith, Jane Kimball, Charlotte Faber, Gabrielle Mazzotte, and Brecken Smith, and alternates Sophie Brankman-Gibbs, Oona Hall, Sofie Fiegl, and Sophia Bosley.
- The students made 100 day projects that are hanging on our bulletin board. We also made ramps in class and learned about push, pull and gravity.
- Young alumni panel with 5 returning alums. Students in grades 9-12 attended.
- Reality Check presentation on vaping shared with students in grades 6-12.
- The newly formed Green Team was awarded a \$500 WILD center grant to increase environmental literacy among students in New York State. Freshman, Thea Shaw, Rachel Story, and Rafe Simmer applied for the grant to purchase a solar panel a cell phone charging station, a composting system, and smart power strips to reduce phantom energy loads in the computer labs. These items will be used in educational stations during our Earth Day celebration they are planning and later throughout the school.

• 6,7, 8 Field Trip to CV-TEC:

On January 10, 2019, our students in grades 6, 7, and 8 visited CV-TEC Mineville campus to learn about the programs offered, such as Marine Technology, Construction Trades, Heavy Equipment, Welding, Natural Resources Management and Outdoor Trades, Automotive Repair, Cosmetology, and Allied Health.

• CFES Brilliant Pathways Essential Skills Training for 9th and 10th Graders:

Elaine Dixon-Cross has been visiting WCS on a monthly basis to train our 9th and 10th graders on the Essential Skills (Goal Setting, Teamwork, Leadership, Agility, Perseverence, and Networking) during their CFM classes. She was here on January 7th and again this past Monday on February 11th.

• CFES Brilliant Pathways and Westpoint Robotics Day:

- O Six 8th graders had a chance to participate in the Westpoint Robotics day hosted at CFES Brilliant Pathways in Essex, NY. Our students learned how to build a circuit and then program that circuit to blink an LED or sound an alarm based on a motion sensor.
